




Alice's Day

One afternoon on 4 July 1862, Charles Dodgson, took 10 year old Alice Liddell and her sisters on a boating picnic up the river Thames from Folly Bridge in Oxford. To entertain the girls he told them about a little girl; sitting bored on a riverbank, who finds herself tumbling down a rabbit hole into a topsy - turvy world called Wonderland. Alice loved the story so much she begged him to write it down, the result was the handwritten manuscript Alice's Adventures under ground. The follow year the manuscript was published as Alice's Adventures in Wonderland under the pen name Lewis Carroll.
