



Jack Petchey?




- From a relatively poor background and very little encouragement, he became a very successful businessman

- Once the list of initial nominees has been drawn, it will be passed on to the Jack Petchey panel, which is made up of past winners from the school and they will choose the winner for that month


The JP Nomination Form

- Forms are available from the Community Team, SSC, or Main Office






The Annual Jack Petchey Achievement Award Presentation Ceremony
